Outbreak of *E. coli* Infections Linked to Romaine Lettuce

The CDC is advising that consumers not eat and retailers not sell any romaine lettuce harvested from Salinas, California: such as whole heads of romaine, hearts of romaine, and packages of precut lettuce and salad mixes which contain romaine, including baby romaine, spring mix, and Caesar salad. If you are buying romaine lettuce at a store look for a label showing where the romaine lettuce was grown. It may be printed on the package or on a sticker. If the label says "Salinas" (whether alone or with the name of another location), don't buy it. If it isn't labeled with a growing region, don't buy it. While Delaware has not had any reported cases, our surrounding states which include PA, NJ, MD, and VA, have reported cases. For more information visit <https://tinyurl.com/RomaineEcoli19>.

CDC Announces Vaping Lung Injury Cases Rises to 2,290

As of November 20, 2019, 2,290 cases of e-cigarette, or vaping, product use associated lung injury (EVALI) have been reported to CDC from 49 states. Forty-seven deaths have been confirmed in 25 states and the District of Columbia, with 3 confirmed deaths in Delaware. The latest national and state findings suggest THC-containing e-cigarette, or vaping, products, particularly from informal sources like friends, or family, or in-person or online dealers, are linked to most of the cases and play a major role in the outbreak.
