DPH Announces 170 New Positive Cases / Three Additional Deaths

According to the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH)**170** new Delawareans have been diagnosed with COVID-19, taking the total number of lab-confirmed cases to **6,277**, including **285** who are hospitalized, **53** of whom are critically ill.

Two hundred twenty-four individuals have died due to COVID-19 in Delaware with ages ranging from 22 to 103 years old. The most recent deaths announced today ranged in age from 86 to 100. Two were New Castle County resident and one was a Sussex County resident. All of the individuals had underlying health conditions. Two individuals were residents of long-term care facilities.
