

#### COVID-19 UPDATE 5-9-2020

In an effort to keep Delaware's medical community current on the latest information regarding the coronavirus crisis, the Medical Society of Delaware is sharing the following:

## DPH Announces 166 New Positive Cases / Eight Additional Deaths

According to the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH)166 new Delawareans have been diagnosed with COVID-19, taking the total number of lab-confirmed cases to 6,277, including 288 who are hospitalized, 55 of whom are critically ill.

**Two hundred twenty-one** individuals have died due to COVID-19 in Delaware with ages ranging from 22 to 103 years old. The most recent deaths announced today ranged in age from 22 to 100. Two were New Castle County resident, two were Kent County residents, and four were Sussex County residents. All of the individuals had underlying health conditions. Six individuals were residents of long-term care facilities.

### What are the Phases of Reopening for Delaware?

Delaware Governor John Carney announced yesterday a target date of June 1

to begin "Phase 1" in reopening Delaware. In order to begin Phase 1, Delaware must meet several standards outlined by the Governor, which includes containing the COVID-19 hot spot in Sussex County. Once all the State's criteria is met, Delaware can begin the first of three phases.

#### Phase 1:

- Vulnerable individuals shelter in place.
- Maintain social distance in public
- Limit gatherings to 10 individuals
- Minimize non-essential travel personal and business
- Encourage teleworking
- Return to work in phases
- Consider special accommodations for vulnerable populations of workforce
- Schools and youth activities remain closed
- No visits to senior living facilities and hospitals.
- Large venues, restaurants would have strict guidelines
- Elective surgeries to resume
- Gyms to follow strict physical distancing and sanitation protocol
- Bars remain closed

### Three Children Die of Newly Discovered COVID-19-Linked Illness

Three young children have died in New York City due to a COVID-19-linked syndrome similar to Kawasaki Disease. Seventy-three children have been sickened by the rare disease in New York. Cases of the illness called Pediatric Multi-System Inflammatory Syndrome Associated with COVID-19, have also been reported in Boston, Philadelphia, and Wilmington, Delaware. Prior to the appearance of this disease, fewer than four children had died in New York as a result of COVID-19. Read more.
