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Scientific articles on medical matters are especially welcomed, including case reports, clinical experiences, observations, and information on matters relevant to medical practice. Other material may also be accepted if the editorial staff deems it of interest to *DMJ* readers. All submissions should include a brief summary and a brief (one to two sentence) biographical sketch of all authors.

It is highly recommended that authors familiarize themselves with *DMJ* style before submitting manuscripts for consideration.

Material for publication should be submitted electronically via e-mail to kathy.jackson@medsocdel.org. The ideal manuscript length is 750 to 5,000 words with up to 12 references, each keyed with superscripts in the text in the order cited. The *Delaware Medical Journal* uses the American Medical Association's *Manual of Style*. Authors are responsible for the accuracy of the citations.

Graphs, charts, and black-and-white glossy photographs are accepted if important to the understanding of the text, but should not exceed five pieces. Electronic copies of each graph, chart or photo should be submitted to kathy.jackson@medsocdel.org. Most graphic formats are acceptable. Photos imbedded in Word documents and Power Point slides are not acceptable.

Photos of patients should generally be taken in a way that obscures the patient's identity. Photos in which a patient's face must be clearly seen, however, must be accompanied by signed release forms.

All manuscripts are reviewed by the editor, and all scientific articles are then sent for peer review by members of the Editorial Board and/or other appropriate physicians. The usual processing time to publication is two to four months, though in some circumstances this may be longer or shorter.
