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New E-Prescribing Regulations

As a provider or pharmacist, you should be aware of the new Delaware Electronic Prescribing law, which will change how medications, including controlled substances, are prescribed for patients. Delaware is transitioning from written to electronic prescriptions. New Delaware and federal legislation will require e-prescribing, with some exceptions, starting January 1, 2021. The federal "Substance Use-Disorder Prevention That Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities Act" was signed into law October 24, 2018, and mandates e-prescribing for all controlled substances covered under Medicare Part D, with a few exceptions. In Delaware, House Bill 115 was signed into law June 27, 2019, which expands this requirement to all prescriptions, with certain exceptions. ONC Final Rule - Information Blocking

In early March, the Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT (ONC) published a final rule that detailed requirements for implementation of the new "Information Blocking" rule put in place under the 21st Century Cures Act, which is intended to enable more widespread access, use and exchange of patient data. The final rule requires all physicians to come into compliance with the new requirements beginning November 2, 2020. While the rule makes several important changes to electronic health record (EHR) vendor technology, including improving usability and interoperability, the rule also states that physicians are required to establish a new compliance framework to handle all medical record requests coming into their office. Information blocking rules require physicians to respond to and release patients' medical records for most requests they receive, unless an appropriate exception can be claimed. Please note that HIPAA compliance rules are still in effect. Starting in November, 2020, physicians will want to examine and update if necessary, all policies and procedures their organization uses to manage medical record requests. Documenting how a physician applies exceptions and their organizational policies to each information request will be important in maintaining compliance with the information blocking rules. While the American Medical Association has requested a one-year extension on this Rule, we want to make sure you start examining your policies on providing medical records information (with patient approval) upon request to ensure compliance while they await a decision from the Federal Government.
