CDC Modifies Previous Mask-Wearing Recommendations

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has recommend that vaccinated people who live in "areas of substantial or high transmission" of the coronavirus should resume wearing masks in indoor public spaces. The CDC published an online map (https://tinyurl.com/dwdt3ppv) showing qualifying areas. CDC data as of Tuesday indicates Sussex County has "substantial" risk of virus transmission and New Castle and Kent counties remain at "moderate" risk, which would not trigger mask recommendations. The recommendations also advise that those vaccinated who have vulnerable people in their households, including young children and those who are immunocompromised, wear masks indoors in public spaces. In addition, the CDC is urging universal masking for all teachers, staff members, and students in K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status and community transmission of the virus. MSD reported last week that the American Academy of Pediatrics had released updated guidelines (https://tinyurl.com/rv9jxjr5) recommending universal masking in schools. CDC Calls For Vaccinated Individuals To Be Tested For COVID-19 After Exposure

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its testing recommendations for people who are fully vaccinated against the coronavirus. The agency now advises that vaccinated people be tested for the virus if they come into contact with someone with Covid-19, even if they have no symptoms. Previously, the health agency had said that fully vaccinated people did not need to be tested after exposure to the virus unless they were experiencing symptoms. The change was prompted by new data suggesting that even vaccinated people who are infected by Delta may carry large amounts of the virus and transmit it to others. COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Period Extended Through October 17, 2021

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has extended the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency for an additional 90 days. This means that the telehealth and other waivers and flexibilities that have been implemented during the PHE will remain in effect until at least October 20, 2021. This renewal marks the sixth time the federal government has done so since the public health emergency was first declared at the start of the pandemic last year.
