Use of Booster Dose for COVID-19 Vaccines

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration took action to expand the use of a booster dose for COVID-19 vaccines in eligible populations. The agency is amending the emergency use authorizations (EUA) for COVID-19 vaccines to allow for the use of a single booster dose. Late Thursday evening the CDC endorsed the Moderna and J&J boosters, as well as a "mix and match" approach for shots.

Biden Administration Unveils Vaccine Plans for 5-11 Year Olds

In anticipation of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) independent advisory committee meeting on October 26 and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) independent advisory committee meeting on November 2-3 (and CDC Director's approval), the Biden Administration announced a plan to ensure that, if a vaccine is authorized for children ages 5-11, it is quickly distributed and made conveniently and equitably available. The start of a vaccination program for children ages 5-11 will depend on the independent FDA and CDC process and timeline. The Administration's plan will mobilize a comprehensive effort across the public and private sectors to ensure that we have the supply, the sites, and the support needed to get our nation's children vaccinated and protected against the virus. Medicare's Perfect Storm

On January 1, 2022, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) will drastically reduce payments (https://tinyurl.com/5m5mtb6h) for certain health care providers. If Congress does not act to stop these cuts, it will further strain practices that are still struggling to keep their doors open during the ongoing pandemic. Physician practices face a stack of Medicare financial hits amounting to a 9.75 percent cut. Recently, Reps. Ami Bera, MD (D-CA) and Larry Bucshon, MD (R-IN) circulated a "Dear Colleague" letter highlighting the financial uncertainty within the Medicare payment system and the dangers facing the physician community if Congress fails to enact legislation to address these problems. Mandatory 10-Digit Dialing Effective October 24

Delawareans with (302) phone numbers will need to dial 10 digits to others in the 302 area code starting October 24th. The change to 10-digit dialing not only affects Delaware but also 16 states and territories and 84 area codes. The reason for the switch is to start 988 as a new national suicide hotline number. The National Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Crisis Lifeline remains at (800) 273-TALK until it moves to 988 on July 16, 2022. Prior Authorization Reform Bill Introduced in The Senate
