Reminder! State Acute Facility Guidelines on COVID-19 Vaccination/Testing Emergency Order Effective 9/30

In August, Governor Carney and the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) announced that beginning September 30th, staff at long-term care and other health care facilities regulated by the DHSS Division of Health Care Quality will be required to provide proof of vaccination or undergo regular testing to prevent the transmission of COVID-19 to vulnerable populations. The Emergency Orders, which contain the emergency regulation with requirements about the mandatory testing became effective September 30th. Also referred to in the emergency regulations is the Division of Public Health (DPH) Testing Guidance. Currently, fully vaccinated staff are not required to be tested for COVID-19 on a routine basis. All unvaccinated staff must be tested at a minimum of once every seven (7) days. Molecular and antigen tests are acceptable. Requirements Related to Surprise Billing: Part II

The Departments of Health and Human Services, Labor, Treasury, and the Office of Personnel Management released an interim final rule (https://tinyurl.com/d7arx8yy), entitled "Requirements Related to Surprise Billing; Part II." This rule details a process that will take patients out of the middle of payment disputes, provides a transparent process to settle out-of-network rates between providers and payers, and outlines requirements for health care cost estimates for uninsured (or self-pay) individuals. Other consumer protections in the rule include a payment dispute resolution process for uninsured or self-pay individuals. DPH Announces Start of Flu Season

October marks the start of the 2021-2022 influenza season, and given the State's ongoing fight against COVID-19, the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH) believes it is more important than ever for Delawareans to protect themselves and loved ones by getting the flu vaccine. DPH is also advising the public that the flu vaccine can be administered at the same time as the COVID-19 vaccine. While DPH no longer holds mass community flu clinics, it will offer flu vaccines at community-based locations where staff are administering COVID-19 vaccines. FDA to Discuss EUA for Boosters and Vaccines for Children

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced two upcoming meetings about COVID-19 vaccines. *VRBPAC Meeting on Janssen and Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Boosters:* On Oct. 14 and 15, VRBPAC will meet to discuss amendments to the emergency use authorization of the Moderna and J & J COVID-19 vaccines for the administration of a booster dose in individuals 18 years of age and older and will also hear a presentation on the heterologous use of booster doses. *VRBPAC Meeting on Pfizer Data on its COVID-19 Vaccine for Children 5-11:* The FDA anticipates receiving a request from Pfizer to amend its emergency use authorization to allow the use of its COVID-19 vaccine in children 5 through 11 years of age.
